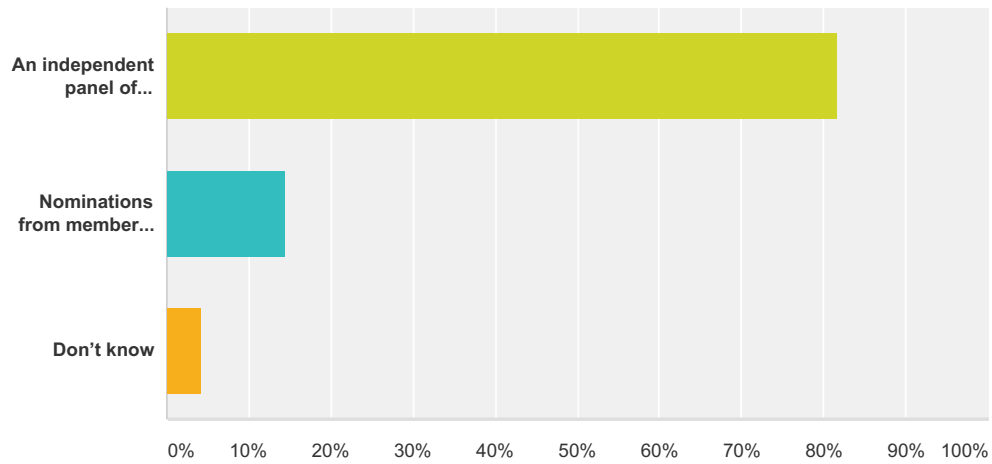


Choosing the next UN Humanitarian Chief

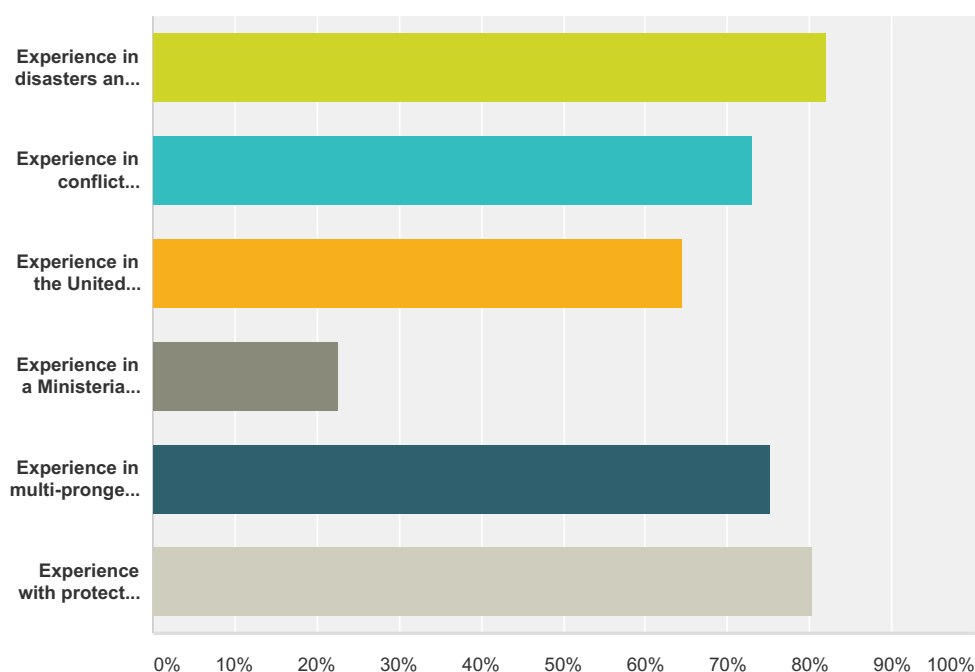

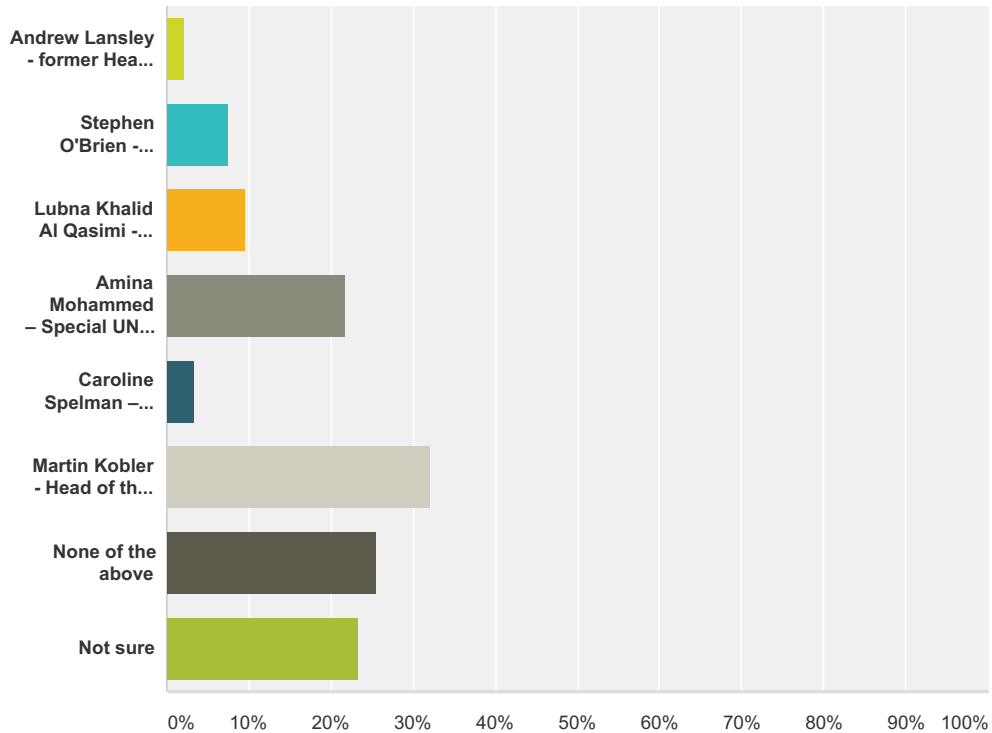

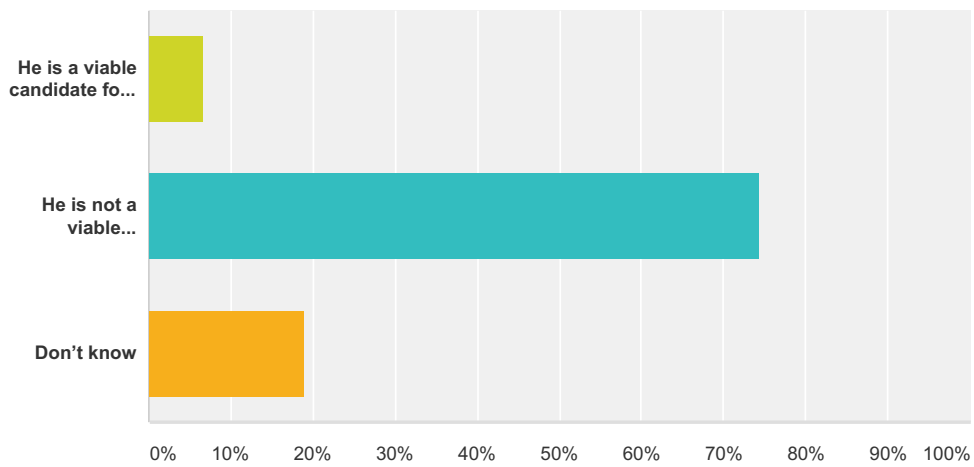

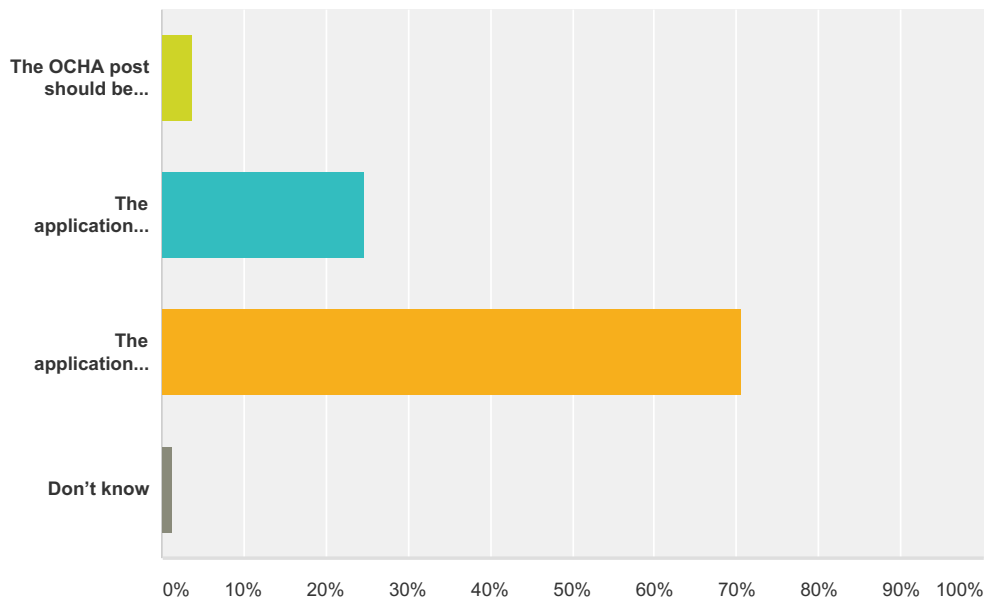
